SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (Commission) action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of BRADLEY SIBOLD (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Respondent holds a full-time law enforcement certification from the Commission, certification number 26587.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Leavenworth County Sheriff's Office from December 28, 2011 to June 14, 2018.
3. On June 5, 2018, Respondent was working as the Booking Sergeant in the Leavenworth County Detention Facility. PT was being fingerprinted and became belligerent. Respondent argued with PT and escorted her out of the

facility. Once they arrived at the exit, Respondent threw PT's personal property on the ground in frustration and pushed PT when she tried to re-enter the facility. PT fell to the ground when Respondent made contact with her.

4. Based on his conduct on June 5, 2018, Respondent was charged and convicted in the District Court of Leavenworth County, Case Number 2018-CR-000464, with one count of battery, contrary to K.S.A. 21-5413.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Criminal Conduct

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(5), the Commission may revoke the certification of any police or law enforcement officer who engages in conduct which, if charged as a crime, would constitute a felony crime under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as defined in the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act at the time the conduct occurred, or a misdemeanor crime that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission.
6. K.A.R. 106-2-2a(a)(6) states that pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616 and amendments thereto, an applicant or officer shall not engage in conduct, whether or not charged as a crime or resulting in a conviction, that would constitute battery, as defined in K.S.A. 21-5413 and amendments thereto.
7. On June 5, 2018, Respondent engaged in conduct that constituted battery.

Good Moral Character

8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and

maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.

9. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
10. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
11. Pursuant to K.A.R. 106-2-4(b), any single incident or event may suffice to show that an applicant or licensee lacks or has failed to maintain good moral character.
12. Respondent's conduct demonstrates a lack of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.

Summary Proceedings

13. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER


Based on the Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of BRADLEY SIBOLD be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF BRADLEY SIBOLD IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.

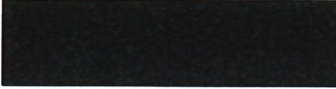
NOTICE OF RELIEF FROM THIS SUMMARY ORDER
