SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (Commission) action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of CHRISTOPHER MICHAELSEN (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. The Commission issued Respondent a provisional law enforcement certification, certification number 30524.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Franklin County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) from May 16, 2018 to September 6, 2018.
3. Respondent was terminated from his employment with the FCSO prior to completing an approved full-time basic course of instruction. Therefore, Respondent's provisional certification was automatically revoked pursuant

to K.S.A. 74-5607a. However, grounds for certification revocation also exist pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b) and are appropriate in this case.

4. On December 22, 2018, Respondent and AM were drinking alcohol and began to argue. The two hit each other in the face, causing both to have visible injuries.
5. Based on his conduct on December 22, 2018, Respondent was charged in the District Court of Franklin County, Case Number 2019-CR-000021, with one count of disorderly conduct, contrary to K.S.A. 21-6203, a class C misdemeanor. On June 3, 2019, Respondent entered a plea of no contest and was found guilty of disorderly conduct.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Criminal Conduct

6. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(5), the Commission may revoke the certification of any police or law enforcement officer who engages in conduct which, if charged as a crime, would constitute a felony crime under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as defined in the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act at the time the conduct occurred, or a misdemeanor crime that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission.
7. K.A.R. 106-2-2a(a)(50) states that pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616 and amendments thereto, an applicant or officer shall not engage in conduct, whether or not charged as a crime or resulting in a conviction, that would constitute disorderly conduct, as defined in K.S.A. 21-6203 and amendments thereto.
8. Respondent's conduct on December 22, 2018 constituted the crime of disorderly conduct.

Good Moral Character

9. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.
10. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
11. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
12. Pursuant to K.A.R. 106-2-4(b), any single incident or event may suffice to show that an applicant or licensee lacks or has failed to maintain good moral character.
13. Respondent's conduct shows that he lacks the personal qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification.

Summary Proceedings

14. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER


Based on these Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of CHRISTOPHER MICHAELSENbe revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF CHRISTOPHER MICHAELSENIS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.

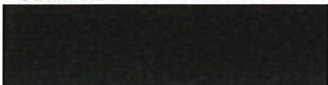
NOTICE OF RELIEF FROM THIS SUMMARY ORDER
