SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Commission action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of CHAD TYLICKI (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Respondent holds a full-time law enforcement certification from the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (Commission), certification number 28483.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Chapman Police Department (CPD) from August 22, 2016 to August 27, 2018.
3. The City of Chapman was conducting a cost-analysis. The CPD examined officer fuel records as part of the analysis. The CPD noticed a discrepancy between the fuel log for Respondent's patrol vehicle and the corresponding fuel invoices. The CPD opened an investigation. The investigation revealed that Respondent's fuel consumption was

unusual; that there were times his fuel card was used but not recorded; that Respondent's vehicle would often average very low mileage when he drove it, but typical mileage if the vehicle was driven by someone else; that Respondent's fuel card was used when he was off-duty; and that Respondent, on several occasions, pumped more fuel than the tank capacity of his vehicle.

4. The CPD interviewed Respondent regarding their investigation into the use of his fuel card. Respondent admitted that on numerous occasions he used the CPD fuel card to obtain gas for his mower and two personal vehicles. Respondent did so on more than ten occasions. Respondent did not have authority to use CPD purchased fuel in his personal vehicles or for his personal use.
5. Respondent used a City of Chapman vehicle to move his personal property out of a storage unit, without authority to do so. Respondent drove a CPD patrol vehicle to a job interview at another agency. He did not have authority to do so, despite his assertions to that agency that he had authority to use the vehicle for that purpose.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Criminal Conduct

6. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(5), the Commission may revoke the certification of any police or law enforcement officer who engages in conduct which, if charged as a crime, would constitute a felony crime under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as defined in the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act at the time the conduct occurred, or a misdemeanor crime that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission.
7. K.A.R. 106-2-2a(a)(26) states that pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616 and amendments thereto, an applicant or officer shall not engage in conduct, whether or not charged as a crime or resulting in a conviction, that would constitute theft, as defined in K.S.A. 21-5801 and amendments thereto.

8. K.A.R. 106-2-2a(a)(45) states that pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616 and amendments thereto, an applicant or officer shall not engage in conduct, whether or not charged as a crime or resulting in a conviction, that would constitute official misconduct, as defined in K.S.A. 21-6002 and amendments thereto.
9. Respondent's conduct constitutes a misdemeanor crime that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission. Respondent's conduct constitutes theft and official misconduct.

Good Moral Character

10. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.
11. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
12. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
13. Respondent's conduct shows that he lacks the personal qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification.

Summary Proceedings

14. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER


Based on the above Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of CHAD TYLICKI be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF CHAD TYLICKI IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.
