**SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Kansas Commission on Peace Officers’ Standards and Training (Commission) action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of KEITH MYERS (Respondent).

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

1. The Commission issued Respondent a full-time law enforcement certification, certification number 11503.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Clay County Sheriff’s Office from June 24, 2016 to March 29, 2021. Respondent was not employed at the time of his domestic battery conviction stemming from November 6, 1999.
3. In 2021, the Commission was notified that Respondent was being criminally investigated for a domestic incident. During the criminal

investigation, it was discovered that Respondent entered a Diversion Agreement after being charged with domestic battery in district court in 1999.

4. On November 6, 1999, Respondent intentionally caused physical contact with a family or household member, CM, in a rude, insulting, or angry manner in violation of K.S.A. 21-3412. As a result, Respondent was charged with one count of domestic battery and other criminal charges in the District Court of Jackson County, Case Number 99 CR 345. On March 6, 2000, Respondent entered a Diversion Agreement on one count of Domestic Battery, K.S.A. 21-3412, and one count Violation of a Protective Order, K.S.A. 60-3107.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

##### Fail to Maintain Minimum Requirements for Certification

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.

##### Misdemeanor Crime of Domestic Violence

6. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(3) states that each applicant for certification shall not have been convicted of a crime that would constitute a felony under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence or a misdemeanor offense that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission.
7. K.S.A. 74-5605(d) states that as used in this section, "conviction" includes any diversion or deferred judgment agreement entered into for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence.

8. K.S.A. 74-5602(j) defines misdemeanor crime of domestic violence to include a violation of domestic battery as provided by K.S.A. 21-3412a, prior to its repeal, or any other misdemeanor under federal, municipal or state law that has as an element the use or attempted use of physical force, or the threatened use of a deadly weapon, committed against a person with whom the offender is involved or has been involved in a “dating relationship” or is a “family or household member” as defined in K.S.A. 21-5414, and amendments thereto, at the time of the offense.
9. Due to entering into a Diversion Agreement for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence, Respondent fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605.

Good Moral Character

10. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
11. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
12. Pursuant to K.A.R. 106-2-4(b), any single incident or event may suffice to show that an applicant or licensee lacks or has failed to maintain good moral character.
13. Respondent’s conduct shows that he lacks the personal qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification.

Summary Proceedings

14. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

**ORDER**


Based on these Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of KEITH MYERS be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF KEITH MYERS IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.
