SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Commission action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of RYAN MOSHER (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. The Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (Commission) granted full-time certification to Respondent, certification number 19686.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP) from July 9, 2001 to February 24, 2023. Respondent was the subject of an internal investigation at the time of his separation from the KHP.
3. The Commission opened an investigation after receiving information that Respondent may have engaged in the conduct of stalking a family member and making false statements during a criminal investigation. There were glaring discrepancies between Respondent's

statements during the criminal stalking investigation and his statements during the internal investigation conducted by the KHP. Therefore, a Commission interview with Respondent was necessary to determine his continued suitability for law enforcement certification.

4. Commission Investigator George Brown scheduled an interview for Respondent and notified him of the date. The nature of the investigation required Respondent to appear in person for the interview. Respondent informed Investigator Brown that he would “pass” on attending the interview at the Commission office. Respondent did not appear for the interview and therefore did not cooperate with the Commission investigation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Failure to Cooperate in Commission Investigation

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(3), the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who provides false information or otherwise fails to cooperate in a Commission investigation to determine a person’s continued suitability for law enforcement certification.
6. Respondent failed to cooperate in a Commission investigation to determine his continued suitability for law enforcement certification.

Summary Proceedings

7. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent’s request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER


Based on the above Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of RYAN MOSHER be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF RYAN MOSHER IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.
