**SUMMARY ORDER OF SUSPENSION**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Commission action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of WILLIAM KRABER (Respondent).

1. Respondent holds a full-time law enforcement certification from the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers’ Standards and Training (Commission), certification number 8869
2. Respondent is employed as a full-time law enforcement officer as the Chief of the Waterville Police Department (WPD). Respondent began employment with the WPD on May 7, 2018.
3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1), the Commission may suspend, condition, revoke, reprimand, censure or deny the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.
4. K.S.A. 74-5607a(b) states that “every full-time police officer or law enforcement officer shall complete annually 40 hours of law enforcement

education or training in subjects relating directly to law enforcement. Failure to complete such training shall be grounds for suspension of a certificate issued under the Kansas law enforcement training act until such training is completed. . . .”

5. Respondent’s last entry for training was on June 28, 2018. Respondent has submitted zero hours of annual training since that time. Respondent therefore has zero training hours for 2019.
6. On April 10, 2019 and August 13, 2019, the Commission Central Registry Manager mailed Respondent a letter indicating that he had not reported any training for the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.
7. Commission Investigator Don Read was assigned to investigate Respondent’s annual training hour delinquency on February 5, 2020. Investigator Read left Respondent a phone message the same day.
8. Investigator Read spoke with Respondent regarding his annual training hour delinquency on February 6, 2020. Respondent indicated that he would fax the records later that afternoon. No fax was received by Investigator Read or the Central Registry.
9. Investigator Read called Respondent to follow-up on February 13, 2020. Respondent indicated that he could not locate the records.
10. Investigator Read spoke with Respondent on February 19, 2020 regarding the delinquency. Respondent stated that he would obtain the training information from another source.
11. Investigator Read left a message for Respondent regarding the training hour delinquency on February 26, 2020.
12. The case was presented to the Commission Investigative Committee on March 4, 2020. The Committee continued the case so that the Chairman could phone Respondent to inquire about his annual training hour delinquency.

13. On May 6, 2020, the Commission Central Registry Manager mailed Respondent a letter indicating that he had not reported any training for the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.
14. Respondent did not submit a request for an extension, modification, or waiver of his 2019 training hours.
15. Respondent has submitted zero annual training hours for 2019 using either the training year (the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019) or the calendar year (the period of January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019).
16. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

### **ORDER**


Based on the foregoing, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of WILLIAM KRABER be suspended. Respondent's Suspension shall remain in full force and effect until completion of the following conditions and further order of the Commission:

- a. Respondent shall complete 40 hours of law enforcement education or training in subjects relating directly to law enforcement to be applied to his 2019 delinquency.
- b. The Waterville Police Department shall send certified reports of the completion of such education or training to the Commission Central Registry.
- c. In addition to the completion of any conditions to lift the Suspension as set forth above, Respondent is further subject to the provisions and requirements of K.S.A. 74-5622(a).

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF WILLIAM KRABERIS HEREBY SUSPENDED.

**NOTICE OF RELIEF FROM THIS SUMMARY ORDER**


