SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for Kansas Commission on Peace Officers’ Standards and Training (Commission) action through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of CAMERON NOONER (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. The Commission issued Respondent a full-time law enforcement certification, certification number 33081.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Overland Park Police Department from November 22, 2021, to January 10, 2023.
3. On September 11, 2022, Respondent was traveling in a vehicle with his fiancé and two minor children. Respondent, who was reportedly extremely intoxicated and confused, grabbed his fiancé’s cell phone and threw it on

the floorboard, causing her to pull the vehicle to the side of the road. After Respondent and his fiancé exited the vehicle, Respondent shoved her into the side of the vehicle, saying, “You deserve this.” Respondent grabbed his fiancé by the hair, threw her to the ground, and held her arms down with his knees while screaming at her.

4. Based on his conduct in paragraph three, Respondent was criminally charged in the Leavenworth County District Court with one count of domestic battery, contrary to K.S.A. 21-5414, Case Number LV-2022-CR-648. Respondent entered into a Diversion Agreement in the case.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Fail to Maintain Minimum Requirements for Certification

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.

Conviction for a Misdemeanor Crime of Domestic Violence

6. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(3) states that each applicant for certification shall not have been convicted of a crime that would constitute a felony under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence or a misdemeanor offense that the Commission determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations of the Commission.
7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5605(d), a conviction includes any diversion or deferred judgment agreement entered into for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence.
8. K.S.A. 74-5602(j) defines misdemeanor crime of domestic violence to include a violation of domestic battery as provided by K.S.A. 21-5414.

9. Due to his conviction for a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence, Respondent fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605.

Good Moral Character

10. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
11. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
12. Pursuant to K.A.R. 106-2-4(b), any single incident or event may suffice to show that an applicant or licensee lacks or has failed to maintain good moral character.
13. Respondent's conduct shows that he has failed to maintain good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in him as a law enforcement officer.

Summary Proceedings

14. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER

Based on these Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of CAMERON NOONER be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF CAMERON NOONER IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.
